

INJECTION GUIDE SUBCUTANEOUS

PREPARE BEFORE STARTING INJECTION(S)

Prescribed medication
Alcohol Wipes/Pads
Syringe and needle
A container for disposal

SUBCUTANEOUS INJECTION

UNDER SKIN / FAT LAYER - Medication: HCG, Insulin, Etc.

- **1. Wash your hands:** Use soap and dry thoroughly. Put on gloves if necessary.
- **2. Open alcohol wipe:** Wipe the top of the bottle and the area where you plan to give the injection. Let the area dry. Do not touch this area until you give the injection. See illustration below for location selection:
- **3. Draw the medication:** Wipe the top of the vial with the alcohol pad, turn the vial upside down, insert the syringe into the vial, and pull back the barrel to your prescribed medication dose.
- **4. Prepare the needle:** Hold the syringe with your writing hand and pull the cover off with your other hand. Place the syringe between your thumb and first finger. Let the barrel of the syringe rest on your second finger.
- **5. Insert the needle subcutaneously:** Pinch together the skin of your stomach. Holding the syringe barrel tightly, use your wrist to inject the needle through the skin into the subcutaneous at a 90-degree angle.
- **6. Injecting the medicine:** Push down on the plunger to inject the medicine. Do not force the medicine by pushing hard. Some medicines hurt. You can inject the medicine slowly to reduce the pain.
- 7. **Remove the needle:** Once the medication is injected, remove the needle at the same angle as it went in. Place bandage over the area where you gave the injection if needed.
- 8. Dispose of the syringe properly.
